\*GOSPEL LESSON (remain standing if convenient,) Luke 7:36-8:3 (NRSV,) *A sinner anoints Jesus' feet. He declares the woman forgiven; this stirs a controversy.*

[36] One of the Pharisees asked Jesus to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and took his place at the table. [37] And a woman in the city, who was a sinner, having learned that he was eating in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster jar of ointment. [38] She stood behind him at his feet, weeping, and began to bathe his feet with her tears and to dry them with her hair. Then she continued kissing his feet and anointing them with the ointment. [39] Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw it, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what kind of woman this is who is touching him--that she is a sinner." [40] Jesus spoke up and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." "Teacher," he replied, "Speak." [41] "A certain creditor had two debtors; one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. [42] When they could not pay, he canceled the debts for both of them. Now which of them will love him more?" [43] Simon answered, "I suppose the one for whom he canceled the greater debt." And Jesus said to him, "You have judged rightly." [44] Then turning toward the woman, he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I

entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has bathed my feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. [45] You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not stopped kissing my feet. [46] You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment. [47] Therefore, I tell you, her sins, which were many, have been forgiven; hence she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." [48] Then he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." [49] But those who were at the table with him began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" [50] And he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

[8:1] Soon afterwards he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. The twelve were with him, [2] as well as some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, [3] and Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their resources.

**Rev. DaeHwa Park becomes our new UMC Savage's pastor July 1<sup>st</sup>.  
Sunday worship will be at 9am!**

Rev. DaeHwa Park, a native of South Korea, is an ordained elder in full connection of Baltimore-Washington Conference. His father is a Korean Methodist pastor. DaeHwa studied Theology as an undergraduate at Yonsei University and graduate work for a Master of Theology in New Testament & Christian Ethics at Methodist Theological Seminary in Seoul, Korea. Park served at several Korean Methodist churches in Seoul. Park also worked in supply depots of the K-17 Fighter Wing with the Korean Air Force.

DaeHwa completed a Master of Theological Studies & Master of Divinity at Wesley Theological Seminary and served at Heavenly Kingdom Korean Methodist Church, Fairfax Station, VA, Metropolitan Memorial UMC in Washington, DC, Gaithersburg Korean Mission Mowatt, Memorial UMC, Greenbelt, MD & Oakdale Emory UMC in Olney, MD. DaeHwa is presently pastor of Saint James UMC in West Friendship, MD since 2010.

In his pastoral ministry, Park has focused preaching, teaching, and leadership building. His overall vision for the church is "to make people blessed!" Working with many global leaders of the church around the world, Park strongly believes "world as parish." Recently he went on 4 VIM mission trips to Uruguay and Guatemala. Beyond the local church, Park is Chair of "Grow Congregation thru Asian American Ministries" of the Baltimore-Washington Conference. He also helped global partnership between Baltimore-Washington Conference and South Conference of The Korean Methodist Church over the last several years.

Park resides in Olney, Maryland with wife, YoungHoon Park, 42, a recent graduate work in music at UMBC, & 3 sons, Gideon, 15; Jeremy, 13; and Theodore, 5.

The Lanham Church was chartered in the mid 1800's. Land was given to the church from the Lanham family and an African American group had formed a house church about this time. At first some of the house church joined for worship with Lanham. They eventually organized as Ebenezer UMC.

Lanham Church later gave its original wooden church to Ebenezer. It was then rolled down what is now Whitfield Chapel Road to Ebenezer's present site. While a "northern" church it did include "southern" clergy during the Civil War, at the same time being an abolitionist congregation. This "Civic Church" of Lanham prospered during the 1960's expansion of Lanham and the Federal government. In the early 1970's there was a decline in membership. Today's congregation is very diverse. About 75% of the active membership is white, and there are many new immigrants from West Africa (Ghana, Nigeria, Sierra Leon, and Congo), the Caribbean, and Guyana. All people are welcomed.
