Lent begins with the imposition of Ashes on Ash Wednesday. Lent is the season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, before Easter. It comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten," which means "spring." The season is in preparation for the celebration of Easter. Historically, it was the time of preparation for the baptism of Christian converts. It is a season for all Christians to engage in self-examination, repentance, prayer, fasting, self-denial; and reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

Gospel Lesson-TEV Pg. 84 "Luke 5:1-11" NIV
TEV: Today's English Version, Pew Bible

One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the people crowding around him and listening to the word of God, ² he saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." ⁵ Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets." ⁶ When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. ⁷ So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink. ⁸ When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" ⁹ For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, ¹⁰ and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners. “Following Jesus” through Biblical Literacy!



During Lent you are invited to encounter the Holy Word taken from the book Deuteronomy, last book of Pentateuch, a new law given to the new generation of the Exodus people. Reading Deuteronomy will help the congregation or the individual person of faith who love to reshape their spiritual journey with the New

Law of God, which was an inspiring source for spirituality of New Testament. Five primary themes of Deuteronomy is selected for Lenten Supper and Study on Wednesdays. You are invited to LSS with light supper. Check it out at 6:15 p.m.

Introduction (1:1-5)

The opening section gives the setting of this part of the Pentateuch and its purpose: a collection of public addresses given by Moses to “all Israel.” These addresses are his last words to the people as they were preparing to enter into the Promised Land, spoken across the Jordan, where the people were gathered after their forty years in the desert.

Historical Recollection & Call to Obedience: 1:6-4:40

Moses begins his explanation of the law with a historical review of God’s gracious acts. The account begins with the historical account of Israel’s departure from Sinai (cf. Numbers 10:11-12). It does not go back to the events of the exodus, though in 1:30 Moses mentions the events in Egypt.

Departure from Sinai (1:6-8; Numbers 10-20)

Moses begins by giving the basis of God’s dealings with Israel, i.e., the promised of the land that God made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The boundaries of the Land are those of the original promises in Genesis 15:1-21.

The Appointment of Leaders (1:9-18)

Here Moses refers to Exodus 18:13-26 (cf. Numbers 11:16, 24), where on the advice of Jethro, his father-in-law, he appointed experienced officials to help in the administration of the nation. (cf. Genesis 12:2; 15:5; Exodus 1:7; Numbers 23:10).

The Spies and Israel’s Rebellion (1:19-46; cf. Numbers 13-14)

The Israelites were en route to the “hill country of the Amorites” (v. 19). They camped at the desert of Paran or Kadesh (Numbers 12:16; 13:26). When challenged by Moses to take the Land (Deuteronomy 1:20-21), the people, because of their lack of faith, requested that spies be sent first (v. 22). Moses, who approved their plan (v. 23a), took their request to the Lord (of which there is no mention in the text). The Lord also approved their plan and commanded Moses to appoint the spies (Numbers 13:1ff.).

Passing through the Transjordan Desert (2:1-23)

The events of Israel’s thirty-eight years in the desert are repeated by reminding the Israelites why the Edomite, Moabite, and Ammonite, territories were not taken. It is also stressed in this section that the whole of the previous generation died during this time (vv. 15-16).

Conquest of the Transjordan (2:24-3:11)

Joshua Replaces Moses (3:21-29): “Be Free From Having a New Leader!”

Moses reminds the people of the encouragement he had given to Joshua, “Do not be afraid of them; the Lord your God himself will fight for you” (v. 22).

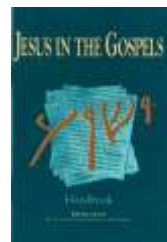
Ministry Opportunities

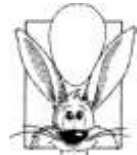
Special thanks to everyone who came out and supported our Boy Scout Troop 424 with their pancake supper this past Tuesday night. \$182 was raised for the church.
