Twenty-ninth Week – Training: A Pastor Gives Guidance

Pray daily before reading: “Teach me your ways, O Lord; make them known to me. Teach me to live according to your truth, for you are my God, who saves me. I always trust in you” (Psalm 24:4-5)

- June 20: Isaiah 55-56, Israel's Coming Restoration
- June 21: Think about your own life and write a paragraph telling how Christ has helped you be “set apart” and yet how much you have to grow to truly be a part of the “royal priesthood.”

Thirty-second Week – Victory: We Never Lose Hope

Pray daily before reading: “Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise him, all peoples! His love for us is strong, and his faithfulness is eternal. Alleluia!” (Psalm 117)
